Mod Podge Eggs

Supplies

- Plastic or Wooden Eggs
- Printed Scrapbooking Paper
- Mod Podge
- Foam Brush
- Scissors
- Newspaper



Directions

1. Scrunch the printed paper into a ball. We want to soften the paper and create a distressed look before putting it onto the egg.

This project can get a little messy, so be sure to lay down newspaper or another material to catch any glue.

For this tutorial, we used wooden eggs with a flat bottom.

2. After scrunching the paper, apply Mod Podge to the egg with the foam brush.
3. Place the paper onto the egg.
4. Set it aside to let dry.
5. Once dry, you can apply another coat of Mod Podge if you'd like.

You can also use tissue paper instead of printed scrapbooking paper to give it a slightly different texture.

Adding embellishments are optional.
