Make a Picture Frame Stand

Supplies

- Drill
- 2 Wooden Candlesticks
- 1 Large Wooden Block
- 1 Wooden Plaque
- Small Dowel
- Acrylic Paint
- E-6000



Directions

Christy wanted to make a stand for the frame so that it can be displayed anywhere in her house rather than on the wall to allow people to see the photo ([using the photo transfer to glass technique](#)) from both sides of the frame.

After drilling a small hole in the bottom of each candlestick, Christy filled the holes with E-6000 and inserted a small dowel to join the two candlesticks. She glued a large wooden block to one of the candlesticks and a wooden plaque to the other to turn it into a stand.

Christy wanted the stand to be the exact color as the frame, so she painted it with brown, and then swiped metallic teal paint in certain areas. She also added the same metallic paint to small areas of the frame to add a little shine.

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Then, the frame was glued to the wooden block on the stand. After you transfer your photo to glass, just insert the glass into the frame and it's ready to display!
