Welcome to American Hero Quilts! We were established in 2004 to provide a recognition and an appreciation to our wounded service men and women who served in the Iraq and Afghanistan wars. We think of each quilt as a metaphoric hug and a way to express our gratitude for their service to our country.

Little did we realize that we would still be providing patriotic guilts to these warriors 20 years later. We have over 800 volunteers participating in our program-ranging from piecers, binders, guilters and other helpers, including generous contributors. And, as of the end of 2023, we provided approximately 32,000 guilts total to our deserving men and women and their families. Our guilts are sent to Madigan Hospital at Joint Base Lewis McCord, other Warrior Transition Centers in the US, and directly to bases in Afghanistan. Thanks to all of you.

Accepting quilt & quilt top donations Now through Mon. May 6th, 2024

Quilts will be displayed in-store May 10th - June 10th, 2024 for customers to vote on their favorite. and to share your beautiful work.

Contest winners will be announced June 11th on our Facebook Page

You may enter as many quilts or quilt tops as you would like. All entries MUST be submitted no later than 4:00pm on Mon. May 6th, 2024.

Please see inside of pamphlet for specifications for the quilt and quilt tops.

1st place receives a \$75 Ben Franklin gift card, 2nd place receives a \$50 Ben Franklin gift card, 3rd place receives a \$25 Ben Franklin gift card, and one voter's ballot will be drawn for a \$25 Ben Franklin Gift Card

Donations:

(if you would like to send donations of the backing, batting and binding along with the quilt top they would be accepted most gratefully)

Backings:

- Should be at least 5" larger on all sides than the top.
- These fabrics CAN NOT be used due to their fibers: Flannel, corduroy, fleece, and fabric with sparkles. Fibers from these fabrics can interfere with the healing process of wounds.
- These fabrics CAN NOT be used due to the nature of the use of the quilts: Light colored fabrics or muslin. Some of the injured have open wounds which can cause stains.

Bindings:

 Strips should be cut from the widths of the fabric. As bindings are the weakest point on any quilt, multiple little pieces sewn together make this weak point even weaker.

Batting:

- Warm and Natural.
- Hobbs 80/20.
- Natural fibers with good wear-ability.

Money:

 American Hero Quilts is a 501 (c) (3) non-profit and 100% of all donations go to buying products to produce the quilts or to quilt them.



Fabrics:

- Must be 100% cotton and of "good" quality.
- Must be prewashed and ironed.
- Must be Red, White, Blue or Patriotic themed.
- May be plain or patterned.
- Can be the bright Red, White and Blue, or the more muted Burgundy, Navy and Off-White

Quilt Size and Pattern:

- Must be no less than 60" wide and 70" long up to Twin Size (69"x90")
- Fabrics should coordinate well within the quilt to create a sense of pride and patriotism for ADULT recipients.
- Any pattern is acceptable as long as it is well put together and sewn carefully with an eye for quality.
- Please do not replicate the pattern of the American Flag in your quilt.
- Please take the time to clip your threads on the back, as these quilt tops will be sent to volunteering Long-Arm Quilters that are donating time and we want to make their work as easy and creative as possible.

Often these quilts are enjoyed day after day by those who have received them, wrapping themselves in them as though they continue to receive the hugs they represent.

Some who receive these quilts are, unfortunately, buried with them. Others pass these quilts down to their own children because of what the gift represents.
