Quilter's Corner at Ben Franklin Monroe  
December 6, 2025

It's time to finish! Square up your blocks and sew them together in the rows shown in your pattern.



I am missing a butterfly block so my top piece is not on...I found that the quilt went together great once the blocks were trimmed to the right size. It is helpful to match seams and pin at the important spots and then work outward. I pinned the center of the fence to the sidewalk first then moved towards the sides.

Once you have your center done sewn together you can move on to the applique. I decided to fuse my pieces on.



My fusible of choice for a project like this is Steam a Seam 2 lite. It is tacky so it will hold in place while you position the pieces and move them around.



Using the applique page in your book trace your shapes onto the paper Peel the back of the paper off of your steam a seam. The sticky part of the steam a seam should still be attached to the yellow grid side. Place it on the wrong side of your chosen fabric. Press. It doesn't have to a super long time, just enough to melt the glue.



Cut out your shapes. I like these micro-serated edge scissors but any will work.





Lay your shapes out on your fabric and adjust how you want them to look. Once I have an idea of where I want things I peel the paper off and stick it to the fabric. It is still re-positionable until you press it.

I would position all of your pieces then take it to the ironing board and press using a pressing cloth. The pressing cloth will protect your iron from any glue bits. Once it is pressed you can stitch around the edges using whatever stitch you want. My favorite is just straight stitching about 1/8<sup>th</sup> of an inch from the edge. Stitch the pieces down before you put your borders on. Some of them might have to be placed after borders are sewn so they can overlap.



Get all of the applique on your borders then sew them on as pictured in your book. You can hand stitch the Quilter's Patch words onto the open spot or applique something in that space, it is your's to be creative with.
