

Quilter's Patch 2025 Saturday Sampler Quilter's Corner at Ben Franklin Monroe June 7, 2025



Step 1

Make your flower log cabin. A log cabin is made with fabrics pieced around another in a square. For this one we are building off half of the square only.



Sew your two small squares together

Add another piece to the bottom



Keep Building





Finished flower

Step 2

Make your leaves. Layer your two leaf fabrics together and draw a diagonal line on the backside of one. Sew 1/4" on each side of the drawn line and cut. Press to one side.



Draw a diagonal line on the backside of a background square. Place it on one corner of the leaf block, sew on the line. Trim 14" away from the seam and press out. Repeat for the other corner

Assemble your stem and leaf section. You will have one leaf facing the right side and one facing the left



side.



Place a flower head on your stems.



Step 3 make your path. Line up your path fabrics in the order that you want them. I followed the color pattern in the book. Sew the sections together





Step 4

Sew your chunks together to make a block

(I think this flower looks like $\ensuremath{\mathsf{ET.}}\xspace)$






Now lets make the fence!

Step 1



Draw a diagonal line on the backside of the background squares. Place on one corner of the post fabric. Sew on your line, trim ¼" away from the seam and press out. Repeat for the other corner. Make all of your posts, your accent posts and your narrow posts.





Step 2. Make your crossbars



Make a strip set with your background and fence strips. Remember to alternate the direction you are starting from when you sew strips together. Start at the top with the first seam then from the bottom on the second seam. This prevents your strips from curving. Sub cut that strip set into small strips.



Step 3 Make your heart gate



Make sew and flip corners on a background square. Repeat for the other corner.






Add a sew and flip corner to the bottom outside corner.



Repeat for the other side. Sew your pieces together.



Trim your wonky top



Add your top and bottom to make the gate.



Assemble all of the pieces to make the fence.
