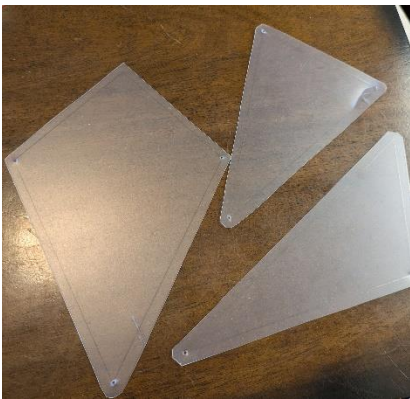

Quilter's Corner at Ben Franklin- Monroe

Step 1

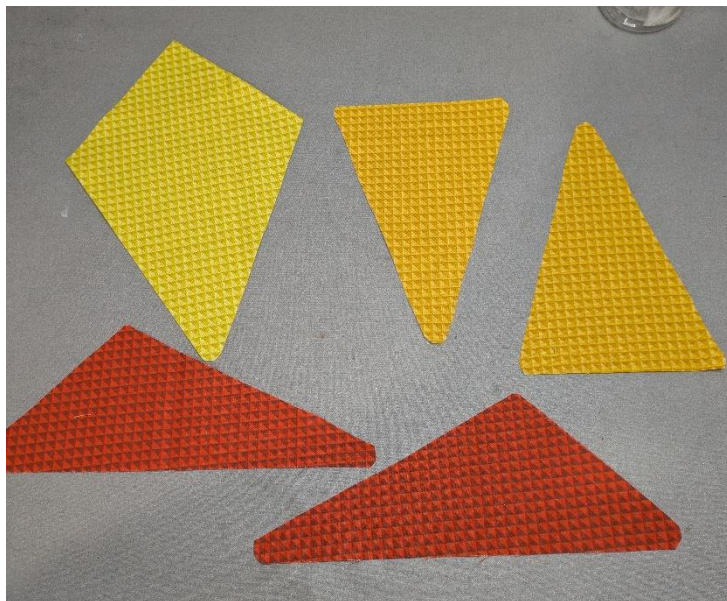
Cut your templates. You can cut out the paper templates or trace them onto template plastic like I did.



Make sure that you are poking holes where the pink circles on your paper are. You will use those to match your fabrics up.

Step 2

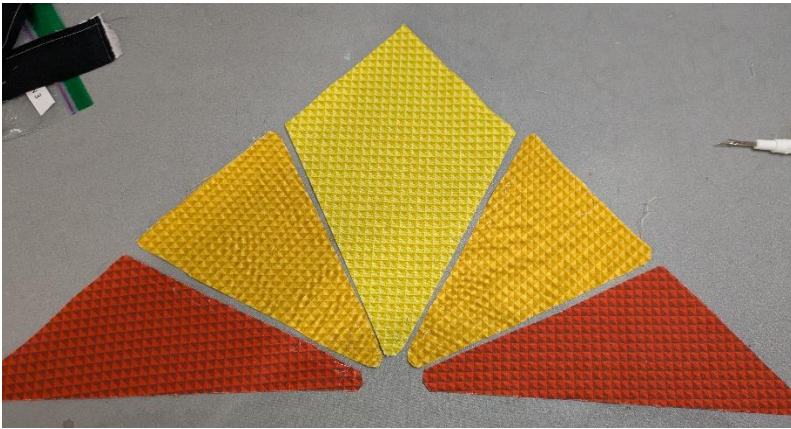
Cut your fabric. I traced my templates onto the back of the fabrics and set a ruler on the line to rotary cut around. You can scissor cut if you want. Pay



attention to the directions some of the cuts need to be reversed images. Make sure you mark the dots from your templates to the back of each piece. This is how you will line everything up.

Step 3

Arrange your fabrics. Double check 😊 I thought I had it the right way and sewed all of it together wrong. This is the correct orientation of the pieces.



Step 4

I drew a line from transfer dot to transfer dot. This is my sew line.

Step 5

I poked a pin through each dot, lined up the fabric and finished pinning.

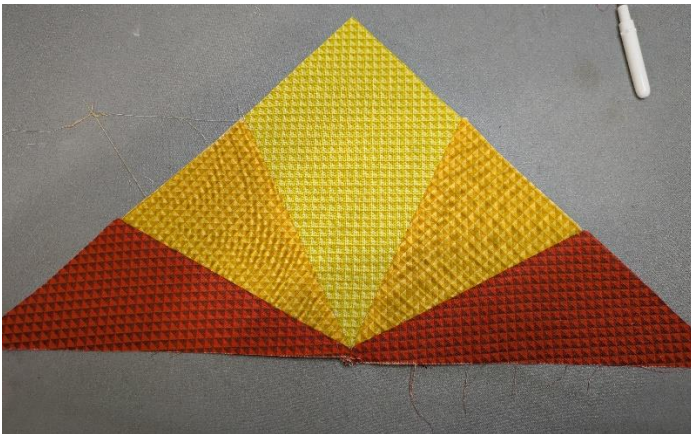


Step 6

If you have your lines drawn it is easy to sew your pieces together. Be gentle, these are bias edges. I started and stopped at each point.
